

AMY M. MCINTIRE

Amy McIntire graduated from Cornell University (Ithaca, NY, USA) with both a B.A. in Economics and a B.A. in Music, where she studied with Pulitzer Prize Winning Composer Steven Stucky.

She then went on to become the first American to graduate with Honors (“Red Diploma”) from the prestigious Moscow Conservatory in Russia with a 3-year post-graduate Degree in Voice. She was then chosen to study and train at the Galina Vishnevskaya Opera Center in Moscow, where she had the opportunity to work with legendary musicians including Mstislav Rostropovich. Amy has performed in recitals, televised concerts, festivals and operatic productions in the USA, Singapore, Malaysia, the Republic of Georgia, Russia, Greece, France and Italy.

Amy McIntire has been a Contract Professor at the University of Pavia’s Department of Musicology and Cultural Heritage since the 2016-2017 academic year, as well as in the Political Science Department where she teaches both the mandatory 9-credit “English for Communications” undergraduate course in the CIM Program (Communications Innovation Media) and the 6-credit “English Language in the Media” course in the Master’s Degree CPM Program (Professional Communications and Multimedia).

In addition, she is currently a Contract Professor at the University of Milan teaching the mandatory English for Communications (6 CFU) course in the *Scienze Umanistiche per la Comunicazione* Degree Program, as well as English for Specific Purposes (3 CFU) in the Department of Veterinary Medicine since the 2018 academic year.

Her fields of interest in research include investigating the interaction between language, culture, literature and music, with a special emphasis on Multimodality for Language Acquisition and Communications purposes.

Amy McIntire’s other professional activities include having been a Commentator on Sky TV (speaking about US politics and international music celebrities), as well as being an International Communications Consultant with extensive experience helping professionals and companies (including top legal firms, multinationals and “Big Four” consulting companies) succeed in the International context.

Amy has lived and worked in 11 countries, and speaks English, Italian, Japanese, Russian, French and Mandarin.
